What to Do Before First Responders Arrive

Medical Professionals from Winston-Salem and Greensboro

When a crew member, volunteer, or passerby is seriously injured on a project, every second matters. Participants will learn what to do for electrical burns, heavy bleeding, head trauma, and broken bones in the key moments *before* first responders arrive on scene. Local medical professionals will perform demonstrations and participants will have the opportunity to practice and ask questions after the training. Participants will also receive additional information on how to set up more in-depth safety training - Stop the Bleed, Red Cross CPR and First Aid, etc. - for their companies or organizations.
